Bunnies on the Bayou has supported Allies in Hope with an \$8,000 grant for the "Camp Hope" Program. Camp Hope is making a triumphant return to in-person activities in 2023 after a COVID-induced hiatus. In 2022, Bunnies on the Bayou provided funding enabling Camp Hope to offer virtual programming and at-home camp experiences.

The program expansion includes support for siblings and the "GLI" (Graduate Leadership Initiative), targeting young adults aged 17-18 living with HIV. GLI empowers them with knowledge about HIV prevention, diagnosis, care linkage, and leadership skills. It aims to prepare Camp Hope graduates for the next phase of their lives as they transition to adulthood.

Bunnies on the Bayou's continued support ensures that Camp Hope remains a beacon of hope and empowerment for young individuals living with HIV, guiding them towards a brighter future.

Bunnies on the Bayou made a substantial contribution of \$12,000 to Avenue 360 Health and Wellness in support of the "Omega House" Program. Omega House, situated in Montrose, provides vital hospice care to individuals suffering from HIV/AIDS. Many of these patients face financial hardship, lack access to care, and suffer without a support network. Bunnies on the Bayou's funding enables 24/7 personalized care, including pain management and emotional support, regardless of income.

Established over 35 years ago, Omega House has made a significant impact by providing end-of-life care that values quality of life, symptom management, and dignity, irrespective of discrimination or judgment. The program's history is rooted in the need to support individuals ostracized by society during the early days of the HIV/AIDS epidemic.

With a patient demographic profile that includes predominantly males, diverse ethnicities, a substantial LGBTQ+ population, and individuals living at or below the federal poverty line, Omega House is dedicated to serving those in their final stages of HIV/AIDS diagnosis with comprehensive hospice care.

The Dalton DeHart Photographic Foundation (DDPF) has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from Bunnies on the Bayou (BOTB) to support the "Photographic Foundation Historical Digitization" Program. This initiative aims to create a digital time capsule of the Greater Houston LGBTQ community spanning three decades. The digitized photos will be easily searchable by organization, date, and individual participant, making them invaluable for researchers and educators. The mission of DDPF is to preserve and provide access to a growing collection of approximately one million photographs documenting Houston's LGBTQ community and its nonprofit and community events. The impact of this project will be the creation of a comprehensive historical record, available for free use, to serve local, state, and national organizations and individuals interested in LGBTQ history and current activities.

The grant from BOTB will help bridge the budget gap and ensure the project's successful completion, making the rich history of the LGBTQ community in Houston more accessible to all.

Bunnies on the Bayou provided \$10,000 in funding to Loud Inc.'s "Houston Splash" Program. Apart from testing initiatives, Houston Splash empowers communities of color in Houston. They organize annual events focusing on health education, including topics like Mental Health & HIV awareness, in creative ways aligned with community values. In collaboration with The Center for Black Equity (CBE), they host leadership conferences to address Black LGBTQ community priorities on both local and national levels.

Their episodic HIV testing partnership targets a sub-population rarely engaged in culturally competent ways, yielding a 12.9% positivity rate. Loud Inc. aims to improve the cultural, environmental, medical, and social health of LGBTQ+ people of African descent through various programs and services, promoting unity and pride while educating on HIV/AIDS and other health conditions prevalent among people of color.

The ongoing support from Bunnies will enable us to become a primary care provider to help end the HIV/AIDS virus $\,$

Bunnies on the Bayou has generously funded M.E.N. Incorporated with \$10,000 for the "MSM Mentoring Program." This program aims to empower young self-identified Same Gender Loving (SGL) or bisexual males, helping them lead fulfilling lives. Through interpersonal and intrapersonal development, it supports their transition into adulthood, including education and life skills. The program fosters connections with the community and same gender loving role models, offering guidance on issues like coming out, reconciling faith with sexuality, workplace navigation, and more.

Bunnies on the Bayou's support ensures quality training, staff competence in LGBT issues, and necessary supplies for program participants. Evaluation will rely on self-reports, interviews, and school progress reports. This initiative creates a safe platform for SGL individuals to seek guidance, professional advice, support, and friendship from same gender loving mentors, ultimately benefiting young men from low to moderate-income areas in Houston/Harris County. It provides safe spaces, networking groups, mentoring, and community learning workshops, enhancing the educational experience for SGL males.

This program offers a safe haven for LGBTQ+ youth, aged 13-24, experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity. On Monday and Thursday nights, we provide hot meals, transportation assistance, clothing, and hygiene supplies, fostering relationships and mentorship. Our \$5 bus passes empower youth to access work, school, and safe places to sleep. In 2023, we aim to expand transportation options. Our mission revolves around improving the quality of life for these young individuals, focusing on building healthy relationships and offering an affirming environment. We are a vital resource for LGBTQ+ youth in a challenging Texas landscape, offering a welcoming space, educational discussions, and essential services, including Tracy's Closet and case management. Our ongoing success is measured not just in numbers served but in the meaningful connections we establish with the youth we support. We remain dedicated to empowering LGBTQ+ youth, providing professional development opportunities, and advocating for those experiencing homelessness. Montrose Grace Place is a beacon of hope in Houston's LGBTQ+ community, offering vital services and a nurturing environment for our youth.

Open Gate Homeless Ministries received a generous \$15,000 grant from Bunnies on the Bayou for the "Hawthorne Dinner Program." This project focuses on enhancing the quality of life for individuals by providing them with hot meals, hygiene essentials, and clean underwear and socks. These basic necessities not only contribute to self-esteem but also serve as a gateway to connecting participants with essential community services, including medical, behavioral, and legal support. By addressing these fundamental needs, Open Gate aims to remove barriers and empower individuals to improve their lives for themselves and their families. The grant specifically supports the core elements of the Hawthorne Dinner program, including dinner services, hygiene items, underwear, and socks. (Funding is not requested for other program components like infant items, Metro Q cards, or gift cards.)

To measure program success, Open Gate employs program statistics and financial reporting, utilizing the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Homeless Information Management System (HMIS) administered by the Houston Coalition for the Homeless.



Teen Outreach Program

Tony's Place was awarded \$10,500 by Bunnies on the Bayou to support our "Teen Outreach Program." The goal is to create safe and welcoming spaces for LGBTQ+ high school students in Houston aged 14 to 19, facing instability. Currently, existing options like school-sponsored Gay Straight Alliances don't fully meet their needs due to various barriers.

With this grant, we aim to establish a sustainable outreach program that includes: Regularly scheduled community building events at Tony's Place drop-in center; Educational and therapeutic programming such as speakers or therapeutic art activities; Provision of snacks and necessary supplies; Social events like art projects, movies, bowling, arcade, or cafe visits.

Once a regular cadence of high school outreach is established, we plan to expand our efforts to reach their families by partnering with PFLAG and hosting meetings at Tony's Place. This grant will enable us to conduct more effective and frequent outreach to LGBTQ+ high school students facing instability in Houston. Our intended impact is to be proactive and preventative in serving LGBTQ+ youth and their allies up to age 25 who are unstably housed or experiencing homelessness. By creating a community that

Trans Legal Aid Clinic (TLACT) received a \$7,500 grant from Bunnies on the Bayou for its "Name and Gender Marker Correction Institute." In Texas, the process of correcting one's name and/or gender marker can be daunting and expensive. TLACT offers free legal assistance, document drafting, guidance on navigating the process, and financial aid to cover costs like court filing fees, fingerprints, and medical support letters. This support is crucial for trans/gender non-conforming individuals facing social and political challenges. Bunnies' funding will help them obtain legally accurate identification documents, preserving their opportunities and safety in Texas.

Trans Legal Aid Clinic of Texas breaks down barriers trans/gender non-conforming people - both adults and minors - face while correcting their names and gender markers on legal documents by providing volunteer legal services and financial assistance to participants, helping navigate and assisting in overcoming the greatest obstacles of self-representation.


